http://tn.freelegalanswers.org/ is a statewide online free legal advice clinic for low-income Tennesseans who might otherwise fall through the cracks of receiving legal help. Qualifying users can post questions about their civil legal needs and receive basic legal information and advice from attorneys.

1-844-Help4TN (1-844-435-7486) is a statewide free phone line offering legal information and referrals to low-income Tennesseans. Help4TN will assist Tennesseans in finding resources to deal with civil legal issues. Those who cannot afford a lawyer may call the line at 1-844-435-7486 and leave a message any time. Calls will be returned by a licensed Tennessee lawyer. www.Help4TN.org has links statewide and local resources for people with civil legal needs.



The Supreme Court created an access to justice website, www.justiceforalltn.com, that has information for people with civil legal needs. The

site has information on how to get free legal help, how to represent yourself in court, links to court forms, and many other resources.



The TJFA is a project of the Access to Justice Commission. It is an alliance of faith-based groups in Tennessee who commit to providing legal resources to their congregations and communities. The notion is to connect with people in need in
